CAMBRIDGE STREET: Quincy to Antrim Streets

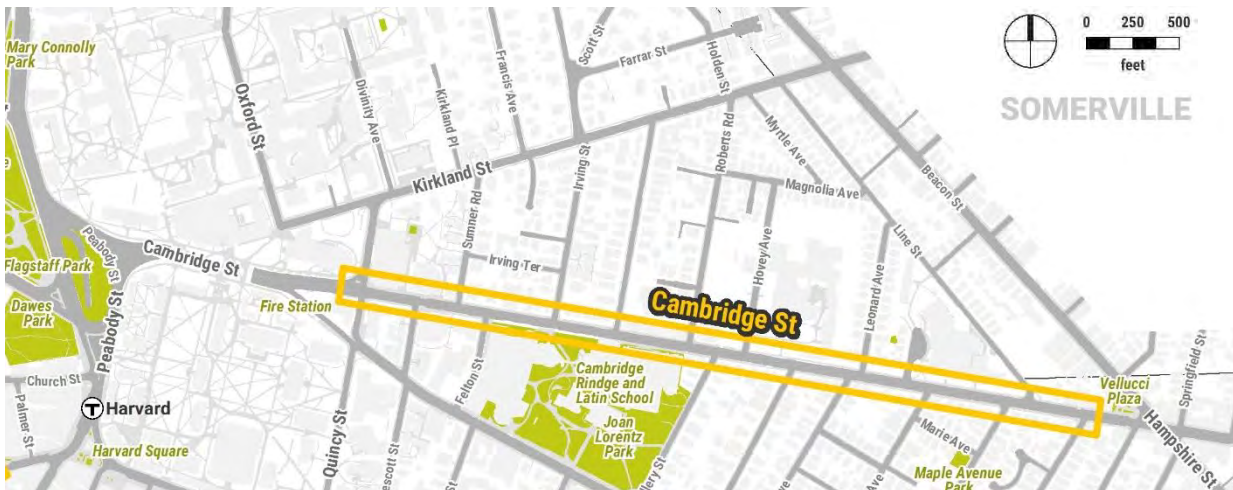
Installation expected beginning nighttime of August 20th (weather dependent)

As a result of a robust community process, this project will create separated bike lanes on Cambridge Street between Quincy and Antrim Streets. The project involves new line striping and signage that will change the road to have two travel lanes, one parking lane and two separated bicycle lanes. With this project, cyclists of all ages and abilities will have a safer way to travel along Cambridge Street between Harvard Square and Inman Square.

What are the Benefits of Separated Bike Lanes?

- Support the City's Vision Zero Goals to eliminate traffic fatalities and severe injuries.
- Support the City's Complete Streets Goals for safe and accessible streets and sidewalks for people of all ages and abilities.
- Supports active, healthy and sustainable transportation.
- Improved travel experience for people walking, riding bikes, and driving.
- Better access to businesses for people biking.
- Added predictability by separating people biking from people driving.



Work on the project will occur mainly at night and temporary parking restrictions will be posted in advance to facilitate the installation.
